

Agricultural Extension in South Asia (AESA), participated in webinars, worked on strengthening of several country fora, and published several outputs from September 2021 to March 2022.

## Country Fora Strengthening

Bangladesh Agricultural Extension Network (BAEN), under the IFAD-funded Last Mile Programme (LMP), co-organized a 'Leadership training for rural youth lead farmers' from 07 to 08 January 2022, in collaboration with Palli Karma Sahayak Foundation (PKSF). It was a two-day residential training where 21 trainees from five NGO partner organizations of PKSF participated.

AESA made a short presentation on the experience of customisation and mainstreaming of the New Extensionist Learning Kit (NELK) into the training/education curricula in South Asia through a virtual Workshop organised by the Central Asia and the Caucasus Forum for Rural Advisory Services (CACFRAS) Network in Uzbekistan on 24 February 2022.

## Networking

AESA participated in a virtual dialogue organised by Commission on Sustainable Agricultural Intensification (CoSAI) and Asia Pacific Association of Agricultural Research Institutions (APAARI), on 'The innovation investment landscape and future food systems' on 28 September 2021. AESA participated in the 8<sup>th</sup> Tropical Agricultural Platform (TAP) Partners Assembly from 23 to 24 November, and the GFRAS 12<sup>th</sup> Annual Meeting during 30 November - 3 December. AESA represented APIRAS at the 2021 Annual Meeting of International Association of Agricultural Sustainability (IAAS) held on 10 December 2021, and presented the findings of the Joint Rapid Appraisal on Strengthening Agricultural Innovation Systems in Asia-Pacific.



This event was co-organised by APAARI, in collaboration with APIRAS, and TAP, hosted by the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO). The main speakers reflected on their personal experiences in research and extension which was very inspirational.

## Knowledge Management

AESA, through its website, published 13 blogs, three good practices notes, four book reviews, 13 meeting notes, and one face to face interview during this period. It has crossed three milestones as it has published the 50<sup>th</sup> Good Practice Note, the 100<sup>th</sup> Meeting Note and the 150<sup>th</sup> Blog during the last six months. AESA led the assessment of 'Integrating Nutrition into Extension and Advisory Services in Telangana (India)' based on the FAO-GFRAS Global Capacity Needs Assessment Methodology and the country report is currently available.
