BACKGROUND

The <u>Tropical Agriculture Platform</u> (TAP) is a G20 initiative, launched in 2012, with the mandate to work towards bridging the capacity gaps for agricultural innovation in the tropics. Its objective is to increase coherence and effectiveness of capacity development interventions for agricultural innovation systems, for sustainable change and impact at scale.

TAP and its 52 Partners embrace an Agricultural Innovation Systems (AIS) perspective, acting as a multilateral and dynamic facilitation mechanism for better coherence and greater impact of capacity development interventions in AIS. To date, TAP achievements include joint development and piloting of its <u>Common Framework on Capacity Development for AIS</u> accompanied by practical tools and manuals; strengthening key organisations and policy makers in nearly 20 countries to integrate TAP approaches into national roadmaps, strategic plans, innovation programmes and projects; and enhancing joint learning through <u>TAPipedia</u>, an open knowledge-sharing system.

The new Action Plan 2022-2025, endorsed by TAP Partners in January 2023, emphasizes mainstreaming AIS approaches at national, regional and global levels. It targets key organizations and policy makers, with a particular focus on integrating inclusive, needs-based bottom-up approaches into AIS. Currently, TAP Partners contribute to implementing the Action Plan through various initiatives and programmes, which are regularly shared with all Partners through the TAP Newsletter, TAP website, social media and, importantly, in TAP Partner meetings.

The upcoming 10th Partners Assembly of the Tropical Agriculture Platform (TAP) from 21 to 23 November 2023 will promote knowledge exchange and learning around the theme: "Strengthening capacities to innovate toward agrifood system transformation". In addition to the Partner Assembly, the meeting will also focus on the technical aspects of the capacity development of AIS to promote innovation at all levels. The event is organized in two parts:

The first day is dedicated to the introductory keynote presentations and the 10th TAP Partners Assembly, to share and learn from the Partners' ongoing approaches for strengthening the capacity of AIS, endorse TAP governance and decisions, and to discuss the expanding role of TAP.

The second and third days of the TAP Partners Assembly focus on technical sessions organized around the three major areas of work of TAP 2022–2025 Action Plan:

- Strengthening innovation capacities at country level
- Roles of Regional Research and Extension Organizations (RREOs) in promoting TAP tools and strengthening AIS
- Promoting policy advocacy and investments in AIS at all levels

TAP Partners and other development partners are invited to share their lessons, success stories and challenges in group work sessions, panel discussions and plenary sessions, with a view to boost synergies and explore future joint action.
